

AKC REGISTRATION

I do have the Puppy's AKC Papers, which needs to be completed and sent back to AKC. Because I am a BREEDER OF MERIT with AKC, I strive to have 100% of my puppies registered. I have found that the best way for me to make this happen is to ask people to bring a check made out to American Kennel Club when they pick up their puppy and for me to send them all in together. Sounds easy enough, right. It is and does work, except that AKC Charges different amounts for a couple of things. The two things the charge additional for that might affect you are:

- 1) You are allowed 36 letters and spaces in the puppy's name for the standard price. You can go all the way up to 50 letters and spaces but it will cost you an additional \$10.00. Most people don't find it too difficult to stick to 36 letters. I REQUIRE my Kennel Name Klasique's (OR in the case of Suzanne Rapier litters born and raised here RiverRoad's Kennel Name) be at the beginning of the name. By this time you are aware of the specific theme your litter is born with and hopefully you have decided on a name within that theme. Klasique's will take up 9 of your spaces, River Roads will take up 11 spaces.
- 2) AKC charges \$10.00 for each co-owner. If you are content with one member of your family being listed on the registration certificate then there is no additional charge. But if you want your spouse, child, significant other it will be an additional \$10.00 for each.

So it is 30.00 to register your puppy, 10.00 additional for registered name exceeding 36 letters and an additional \$10.00 for each co-owner. I ask that you bring a check in the appropriate amount. If you have difficulty understanding I will help you when you are here. I will have you sign the papers and I will send them in. I support AKC for a variety of reasons. You will receive a nice registration certificate and other useful tools about raising puppies from AKC.
